

Announcing the 2017 Retail Program Standards Grant Program

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the Association of Food and Drug Officials (AFDO) are proud to announce Year 4 of the AFDO-administered Retail Program Standards Grant Program. The program provides funds for the completion of projects and training to enhance conformance with the Retail Program Standards.

- Sub-award funding available to jurisdictions in 2017 is estimated to be more than \$2 million. This will enable a significant number of awards for jurisdictions in all four project categories.
- Funding is open to state, local, territorial, and tribal regulatory retail food programs enrolled in the Retail Program Standards. Jurisdictions that applied for and/or were awarded funds in previous years <u>are</u> eligible to apply for calendar year 2017 funds.

- Category 1: Small Projects (up to \$3,000) Examples: Completion of Self-Assessments, Verification Audits, Small Projects that help advance or maintain conformance with one or more Standards
- Category 2: Moderate Projects (\$10,000 to \$20,000) Examples: Completion of Foodborne Illness Risk Factor Studies, Implementation of Comprehensive Intervention Strategies to Reduce Risk Factors, Moderate Projects that help advance or maintain conformance with one or more Standards
- Category 3: Training (up to \$3,000) Examples: Travel to training courses, workshops, and seminars that advance the goals of the Retail Program Standards
- Category 4: Food Protection Task Force Projects (up to \$3,000) The goal of this new
 category is to advance conformance with the Retail Program Standards by supporting
 attendance at Food Protection Task Force activities (or similar Food Advisory
 Board/Council activities, whether or not the Task Force/Board/Council is supported by an
 FDA grant).
